

This year has been marked by significant moments which show strength and a steadfast commitment to our mission across all stakeholders. Despite challenges posed by the staffing, pathway, and salary crises, we have continued to use our strategic plan to guide decision-making and resource allocation to achieve specific objectives.

Promoting awareness, strengthening connections, and improving the pathways to the profession have been a top priority for ACLP this year. It is with great pleasure to report that 70 new programs signed the equity pledge in 2023!



FINANCIAL REPORT

ACLP is committed to financial health, integrity, compliance, and transparency with our members. The Finance Committee is charged with monitoring the financial health of the organization, ensuring that its assets are protected, its resources are used properly, and that the organization complies with all applicable laws and reporting requirements.

The committee conducts regular and rigorous reviews of financial documents, budgets, tax forms and the annual audit. ACLP utilizes financial experts to manage our accounts and investments, perform an independent audit, and prepare our tax forms. Oversight and support for the budget and tax forms is provided by the Board and ACLP staff. We utilize the current ratio tool to measure the ability for ACLP to cover its obligations using current assets such as cash and investments.



FINANCIAL REPORT CONT.

Association of Child Life Professionals, Inc.



The current ratio is current assets divided by current liabilities. This measures ACLP's ability to cover its obligations using current assets such as cash and investments. A ratio of 1.0 indicates that current assets equal current liabilities. A ratio of 2.0 or higher is desirable.

The 4.4 number above shows we are financially stable, without debt, and able to cover our expenses. ACLP's revenue comes from four primary sources: grants, membership dues, membership services (e.g. conference and educational offerings) and investment income. This revenue helps to cover ACLP expenses. ACLP expenses are primarily comprised of human capital, professional development, and education and grant-funded projects such as the Emotional Safety Summit II and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion initiatives.

I am pleased to report that the 2022 financial stressor of lost investment income is no longer a stressor for ACLP as investment income is \$107k, year to date, compared to a loss of \$256k at this time last year.

Your membership, volunteer time, and donations made the following accomplishments possible this year!

Strategic Priority Area 1: Communicate Value and Raise Awareness

- Hosted the Emotional Safety Summit II. Funded by Disney, the work from both days provided valuable insights into the key themes, ideas, opportunities, and challenges related to advancing emotional safety in medical settings.*
- Developed the Gun Violence Prevention & Safety Advocacy Toolkit for Certified Child Life Specialists to use as a resource to have their voices heard.
- Launched the new ACLP website which includes features such as now being mobile responsive, updated navigation, design, layout, and content within the website to enhance the user experience.

Strategic Priority Area 2: Partnerships, Collaborations, and Connections

- Conducted first in-person meet-ups at the 2023 Child Life Conference for members of color as well as the LGBTQIA+ affinity group.
- Launched the new ACLP Professional Code of Conduct to maintain a standard of conduct that upholds the integrity of the association as well as to ensure individuals are demonstrating professional conduct.





Strategic Priority Area 3: Optimizing the Pathways to the Profession


- Launched the Internship Readiness Project which included the new Internship Readiness Common Application, accompanying resources, and listening sessions for key stakeholders.
- Updated the Internship Equity & Access Pledge to align with the new Internship Readiness Common Application. In 2023, 70 new programs have signed on and committed to the pledge.
- Hosted the Staffing Crisis & Pathways to the Profession Think Tank. This collaborative discussion focused on current practices, challenges, and opportunities informing the sustainability of the existing child life workforce and related internship opportunities. The discussion culminated in recommendations from participants on what ACLP can directly introduce, influence, and implement to help alleviate this complex issue.
- Launched the Academic Excellence Task Force.
- Hosted the first-ever aspiring professional resource center at the 2023 Child Life Conference

Strategic Priority Area 4: Excellence in Professional Practice

- ACLP Bulletin is now open access providing high-quality resources and content to the entire child life community.
- New platform and structure for the ACLP Mentorship Program will enhance the participant's experience by allowing individuals to connect on-the-go through one platform.

Strategic Priority Area 5: Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

- Funded by Disney, ACLP launched the new Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) course titled, Introduction to Intersectional Relationships in Child Life Practice which was worth 4.0 PDUs and free for ACLP Members.*
- Funded by Disney, ACLP hosted multiple, free, Racially Conscious Collaboration sessions during Child Life month for individuals looking to further enhance their DEI skills and knowledge.*
- Funded by Disney, ACLP implemented a mandatory DEI training for new committee, task force, and work group members to ensure all volunteers and leaders of ACLP possess a shared DEI framework and knowledge.*
