Leadership is a relationship between those who aspire to lead and those who choose to follow. Sometimes the relationship is one-to-one. Sometimes it's one-to-many. Regardless of the number, to emerge, grow and thrive in these disquieting times, leaders must master the dynamics of this relationship. They must learn how to mobilize others to want to struggle for shared aspirations. Facilitators will guide a discussion of the five practices of exemplary leadership (Kouzes & Posner, 2017). Examples of practice strategies shared within each small group will be reported out to generate ideas to support attendees as they evaluate and develop leadership knowledge and skills.
