

FTE Definitions

Art Therapist: a clinician who provides therapeutic intervention with creative art process as the focus

Artist in Residence: employee who uses their background as an artist as the basis for interactions with patients

Administrative Assistant: employee who provides administrative support to staff

Child Life Assistant: employee who provides play opportunities and program support

Child Life Specialist: clinician who provides psychosocial interventions based on developmental needs of patient and family

Dance/Movement Therapist: a clinician who provides therapeutic intervention with dance and move as the focus

Drama Therapist: a clinician who provides therapeutic intervention with drama as the primary intervention focus

Education/Training Coordinator: specialist who provides oversight and coordinates education and training for employees and/or students

Family and Children's Librarian: employee who oversees book loaning programs, often within a family resource center setting

Integrative Care Specialist: a clinician who provides integrative care services that may include reiki, healing touch, aromatherapy, massage therapy, acupuncture, and other holistic services

Massage Therapist: a clinician who provides massage therapy as the primary modality of intervention

Medical Clown: an employee who uses their background as a clown as the basis for interactions with patients

Music Therapist: a clinician who provides therapeutic intervention with music and all of its facets as the focus

Media Technologist: an employee who provides technology or broadcasting support through closed-circuit TV programming; manages departmental technology

Recreation Therapist: a clinician who provides therapeutic intervention with recreation as the focus

Research/Quality Improvement Specialist: an employee who oversees research, quality improvement efforts, and evidence based practice efforts for the department or within the hospital
