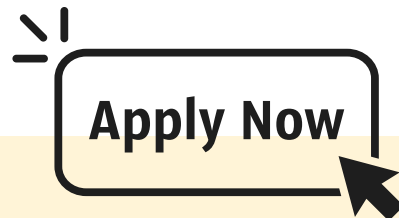
ACLP CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS

Education & Training	3 Hours	15	Open to academic and clinical specialists. Experience with supervising students, writing exams, or conference presentations preferred.	Yes
ACLP Bulletin	2 Hours	8	Strong writing skills including understanding of grammar, mechanics, and organization as well as the ability to communicate constructive and specific feedback.	Yes
